



Dear Parents,

Thank you for the opportunity to pour into your student over the last few weeks about what God's word says about sex and holiness. We have looked at sex and sexuality that are right in the eyes of God; what constitutes sexual immorality and what its consequences are; and a practical plan for accountability in our lives. We still have three weeks left in our series. This week we will be looking at the call to boldly living a holy life, especially as it pertains to the motivation for their attitude toward sex and sexuality. Then next week we will look at the powerful purpose of embracing the idea of holiness. We will conclude our series with a Q&A. As we have gone through the series, students have been able to submit questions to 863-417-8210. This will give Heather and I the opportunity to meet the students where they are and answer some of their most pressing questions.

Couple of things are coming up that I don't want you to miss:

- **Disciple Now (March 10-12)** is a student weekend where students will experience a "mini camp." They will get dropped off the evening of March 10<sup>th</sup> for our opening session and will be dismissed after our final session on Sunday the 12<sup>th</sup>. The cost is \$65. It will be an incredible time of spiritual growth and a whole lot of fun. Our theme this year is Truly Free. For many students, the stress, pressure, and brokenness of their lives is at times, too much to bear. But the excellent news is that there is tremendous hope in the Gospel. When students feel trapped by their sin, the Gospel says, "You're a slave no longer." When students feel like they don't match up, the Gospel says, "You have immense value to God." When students feel overwhelmed by the stress of their lives, the Gospel says, "There is rest in Jesus." And when students don't feel like their lives matter, the Gospel says, "Your life is meant for more than this." In a word, the Gospel sets students free. Truly free. We believe that over the course of the weekend, they will truly see the radical difference God makes in the lives of His people.
- **Student Camp (July 10-14)** is an incredible time for students to get away, recharge and reset their spiritual walk. This year we will be going to the Centrifuge camp at Southeastern University in Lakeland, FL. The theme for this year is "In His Image." At some point in our lives, we have all struggled with our image - what we look like, who we really are, how we fit in, what we stand for. As humans, we are uniquely created in the image of God. If you believe this to be true, what does that mean for your life and others around you? As Christians, we are called to bear this image like Christ did on earth. Therefore, we are called to live as a new creation, one who is set apart and is a reflection of the God who created us and loves us.
- **1<sup>st</sup> Annual Student Ministry Golf Tournament** is on April 15<sup>th</sup> from 7am-Noon at River Greens Golf Course.
